PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Parish meeting was held on Wednesday, 30th May in the Village Hall. The Chair, Philip Shakeshaft, summarised the year for the Parish Council. Matters dealt with, and ongoing, included Planning, the loss of the bus service to Whitchurch, the resurrection of the Neighbourhood Plan, the reinstatement of the bridleway to Wirswall, the disbandment of the Whitchurch Joint Cemetery Board. He offered condolences to the family David Ratcliffe, a long-standing member of the Parish Council.

Updates were given on the purchase and installation of defibrillators for the phone boxes at Marbury and Wrenbury and the possibility of funding for replacement equipment for the play area.

Representatives from village organisations gave reports of their year's activities:

The Church had seen a busy year with 16 weddings, and baptisms. The cost of running the church was now £1,000 per week plus a lot of contributory voluntary work. The Parish Council was thanked for its contribution to the costs of the Parish Magazine.

Marbury W.I. membership numbers were down but continued to provide lots of activities including book club monthly meetings, Craft entries at the Cheshire and Nantwich shows, outings, a variety of speakers at meetings and they thanked the village hall for maintaining the hall in such good condition.

The Village Hall Committee had run very successful events over the year; many residents and the committee members worked hard to keep the facility running for the community. 4 members, including the Chair, Clare Hollins, were standing down this year—new members would always receive a warm welcome!

The Community Pride competition did not take place last year. Though now running again the village would not be making an entry until next year, when, hopefully, the centre of the village would be in better condition. The aspect of a Neighbourhood Plan needed reviewing, whether it is necessary in view of Cheshire East's Local Plan etc. The parish will have to accept some house building—it would be a matter of where would be appropriate or acceptable. Members for the committee would be welcomed. The Police cluster group meets every 3 months; residents are requested to keep the police advised of any concerns in their area.

The meeting was followed by the AGM of the Parish Council. Lisa Tiplady was introduced as the new Clerk. Phil Shakeshaft was re-elected as Chair, Rob Perry as Vice-Chair. Representatives to other organisation were elected—Village Hall, Police Cluster group, Civic Pride.

There was discussion as to the viability of the Play Area as a quote for refurbishment was about £31,000. John David would pursue the possibility of Lottery funding.

Borough Councillor, Stan Davies, told the meeting that it was hoped the repairs to the rash of potholes would be undertaken in the better weather; residents were encouraged to complain about the state of the road at the Chinnel. The Cheshire East Local Plan now enables the authority to refuse planning in the open countryside.

A further planning application for a wedding and events venue at Grange Farm, Hollyhurst, was discussed. It was unanimously agreed that the PC objected to the application on the same grounds as previously—the increase in vehicles on unsuitable roads and the potential disruption to residents through noise and traffic.

An application from Townley Grange for a tennis court was responded to with no comment.

The Clerk reported that she was working with Geraint Jones on the recording and reporting of the internal finances with a 3 monthly updated spreadsheet.

The meeting concluded with a presentation to Geraint in recognition and appreciation of the (almost!) 35 years he had served as Clerk to the Parish Council. Councillors and Village Organisations had contributed to gifts of a painting (by one of his favourite Welsh artists!), a set of Royal Welsh Crystal glasses — and some malt whisky!

My name is Sarah Webster; I'm originally from Marley Green where my parents still live. I get married on the 25th August at Marbury Church, then back at my parents in Tipis...so a bit different to a marquee.

We are holding a charity event on the <u>Sunday, 26th August</u>. This is to represent 3 special people that won't be at the wedding: my sister-in-law, who committed suicide coming up for 5 years ago, and my best friend, who died in the same year - they were both only 41, also my mum's best friend, who fought cancer for over 20 years. She spent the last week of her life in St Luke's.

Therefore we are raising money for **MIND**, the mental health charity, and **ST LUKE'S HOSPICE** at Winsford.

We have named this event "The Celebration of Angels". There will be a live band - "WAYNE and The Hairy Peaches" - and an Auction of Promises and Raffle. We are getting some great things in for this but obviously there is no obligation. There will also be a licensed bar.

The tickets are £20 and will include a hog roast (or vegetarian option) and the event is open to anybody who would like to attend an enjoyable evening.

The event will take place at Marley Lodge Stables, Marley Green, Marbury.
