November Parish letter 2019

'God said, "Let there be light", and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness.

God called the light 'Day' and the darkness 'Night'... (Genesis 1: 3-5)

Night Time signifies many things: apart from the rest and refreshment that sleeps brings, the night is a time for gazing at the stars, dreaming and loving. For some it means keeping vigil as they look after the very young, or the sick. For others, it means working so that others may rest peacefully. For most people, there are occasions when the night brings no relief: when we are worried or afraid, trouble never looms larger than in the early sleepless hours.

Yet, such times can lead to a richer experience of prayer and reflection...

As we journey deeper into the Winter months the nights begin to draw on and the days shorten and we're thankful for the warmth of lamps and lights to add a welcome to our homes. Christmas lights spring up on tree and hedge, gable and front door lifting the gloom...but in days gone by the dark evenings were lit by candle only and the working day was curbed by the loss of daylight. During those times Evening Prayer became a natural part of life's daily round...

'Day is dying in the West, heav'n is touching earth with rest, wait and worship while the night, sets her evening lamps alight through all the sky...' (Mary Artemisia Lathbury).

Both in home and church people turned to thank God for His goodness through the day, its tasks performed, and to ask for God's protection through the night.

'The Lord grant us a quiet night and a perfect end' asks the order of service for Evening Compline...'Keep me as the apple of your eye; hide me under the shadow of your wings. Preserve us, Lord, waking, and guard us sleeping, that awake we may watch with Christ, and asleep we may rest in peace.'

Jesus was often to be found in the early hours of the morning, alone in prayer, following a long and tiring day of ministry and healing...

So don't allow the darkness to breathe its heaviness into your soul this Winter, welcome it as a time of rest and refreshment and use it to lift your thoughts to a higher place...

Watch over us as we rest, O God, as a Mother tends her sleeping children. Grant us the perfect peace of those whose minds are fixed on you, and the assurance of your love, that we may awake with body, mind and soul refreshed, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (Michael Counsell).



THE STORY BEHIND THE NAMES ON OUR WAR MEMORIAL WW1

8702 Pte. WILLIAM MADDOCKS, 2nd Bn. Cheshire Regiment, died of wounds May 11, 1915, possibly sustained during the Second Battle of Ypres, on the Frezenberg Ridge. Born in Marbury and enlisted in Chester. Buried Hasbrouck Communal Cemetery, Nord, France and commemorated on the Marbury War Memorial. Son of Thomas and Annie Maddocks of Old House, Gaunton's Bank, Norbury. Enlisted on 5th November 1907 after working as a labourer. Went to France (Le Havre) on 16th January 1915. Died of wounds in No. 10 Casualty Clearing Station at Hazebrouck.

Five other brothers served during the War. Wilfred and Job survived, but Thomas, Joseph and John all died during the conflict.
