Our Christingle service will be at St Michael's Church on Sunday, 8th December at 11a.m.


This Service will be led by Revd. Veronica Green. We look forward to welcoming everyone.

A December love story...

PARISH COUNCIL Meeting on Monday, 11th November.

The ongoing issue of the road damage at Wirswall was raised; it was agreed to ask Roy Cooke, from Cheshire East Highways, to attend a meeting to address residents' concerns.

Funding for the refurbishment of the Play Area had been impossible to source; a loan from the Public Works Loan Board was agreed in principle. Repayment would be funded by a slight increase in the Precept. It was proposed to hold a short open meeting to give details to residents before the next meeting on 13th January.

Chris Wheeler volunteered to speak to Wrenbury regarding the action they undertook to instigate their Neighbourhood Plan as it was agreed that the Plan was essential for Marbury.

Some response had been received regarding the Selecta DNA kits and it was agreed to order 25 kits with signs at a cost of £10 per household.

It was agreed to submit "no comment" regarding Planning Application 19/5165N for The Granary, Swanwick Green.

It was noted that the A49 would be closed at Bickley crossroads between 18th-23rd November and it was suggested that this could be a suitable time to make changes to the white-lines at Bradeley Green. The meeting agreed to co-opt Andy Ashton as a Councillor for Marbury.

The next meeting will be on Monday, 13th January, 2020.

The public and press are welcome to attend.
