

'A Friend,' says the Wise Man, 'is the medicine of life.'

Medicine may meet our physical needs but perhaps these days medicine is too easily relied upon to meet other wounds, in our soundness of mind or general well-being?

In 1143, Aelred, Abbott of Rievaulx (A North Yorkshire Abbey), wrote, 'what happiness, what security, what joy to have someone to whom you dare to speak on terms of equality as to another self; one to whom you need have no fear to confess your failings; one to whom you can unblushingly make known progress you have made in the heart and before whom you can place all your plans!'

We need Friends...

Friendship brings something into our lives that nothing else can. In every necessity a friend's service, words, actions, understanding and love can raise our spirit more than any other pick me up!

Wise council from a loving friend can bolster dark thoughts that can break us, upholding our belief in our humankind.

The Post Office Workers who suffered such injustice needed 'a friend', someone who understood their circumstances and someone who cared enough to do something. Often, it takes just one other person to change things.

Jesus had friends. Some of them loved Him so much that they fell headlong into a relationship with Him that blew their character wide open, and they began to see their own shortcomings quickly. Some of them doubted His words and their journey with Him was slower, as they took time and effort to truly understand Him. One of His friends betrayed Him, never fully seeing who He was and why He was!

Human friends can come and go for various reasons, interrupting our lives as they bring us genuine care and momentary relief, just like those who were in Jesus's friendship circle. For at the darkest moment of Jesus's life – every one deserted Him.

Our humanness tests us in so many ways. And if we learn from our experiences along the way, perhaps our friendship with others becomes a stage in our thinking and being that assists us in seeing the love and understanding of each other, and of God Himself, who created us in His own image. In being a friend to others, we become the friend of God. 'I no longer call you servants,' Jesus said to his disciples, 'because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father, I have made known to you.' (John 15:15).

It was on the cross that Jesus' friends realised just how much He loved them. They watched from afar as He breathed his last, His arms outstretched, as if to say I love you this much. They witnessed His burial, and went back to their business without Him, but a relationship with God is like no other. Jesus came back, and overcame death itself to be with them forever, to lead them, guide them and mentor them as only a true and loving friend can...

PARISH COUNCIL

Borough Councillor James Pearson attended the meeting on Monday, 8th January and heard of the many complaints from residents about the state of local roads. He sympathised, whilst realising that C.E., like most other Authorities, had limited funds to direct to repairs. However, he promised to hold C.E. to account and asked that people persist in reporting faults. Two representatives from Wrenbury P.C. also attended; it was agreed to work on a Pan-Parish basis to co-ordinate responses. When repairs are carried out, if they are not to a satisfactory standard, these should also be referred back to C.E., as works are carried out by contractors and their work can then be monitored.

PCSP Sharon Jones also attended the meeting; she will endeavour to visit a community event in the Village Hall to hold an informal surgery.

The next meeting will be Monday, 18th March. Residents are welcome to attend; however, if you wish to speak at the meeting, please contact the Chair or the Clerk beforehand. Public speaking time is limited and only Councillors may take part in discussions/decisions.
